



NATURAL REMEDIES FOR DOG WORMS

1. CARROTS - Carrots are offensive to all parasites, according to home remedy website Home-Remedies-For-You.com. Children are often treated for threadworms by eating shredded carrots, and dogs can get rid of worms by doing the same thing. While it is recommended that humans treating for worms eat the carrots with no other food accompaniment, you will have to determine whether your dog will eat carrots by himself or if you will have to mix it in with the food. Either way, this should help the worms pass through the system.

2. CRUSHED PUMPKIN SEED - you need only add 1/4 teaspoon daily. You can do this for two weeks and then add wheat bran to your dog's diet. You need to make sure you soak the bran in water, and then add 1/8 of a teaspoon for every 10 lbs for larger dogs, but then only a pinch for smaller breeds. The beauty of this is it's natural and will save your having to treat your dog for worms.

3. PEPPERMINT AND CINNAMON - Sometimes speeding along proper digestion in your dog can rid him of worms. Natural herbs such as peppermint and cinnamon are known to aid in digestion, according to Dogcare.com, and will flush worms out of the intestinal tract of your pet. These are pleasant tasting herbs that can be added to food and your dog should willingly gulp down his normal meal with some of the herbs mixed in

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4. GARLIC - is mostly used due to its medicinal properties. You can moderately give garlic to your dog.
